HISTORY LESSON 101

Tupelo is named after the "Tupelo" gum tree, which was once prominent in the area. The first European to see the area was Hernando De Soto in 1540. The native Chickasaws battled De Soto and drove him westward where he discovered the Mississippi River near present day Memphis.

In 1736 a large battle took place at the height of the French and Indian War

between the British armed Chickasaws and the French armed Choctaws. The battle established British control over most of the SE. Tupelo was major stop along the Indian trade routed Natchez Trace. As English settlers flooded the area in the 1700's the Trace was a major travel route for

The area was the site of a large Civil War battle which was won by the Federals who gained control of the railroad that aided in supplying Sherman

as he advanced through Atlanta on his "March to the Sea".

The city of Tupelo was incorporated in 1870 in "dry" Lee County (after Robert E Lee) and quickly established itself as a major crossroads. Tupelo also has the distinction of being the first city supplied with reliable electricity form the newly founded Tennessee Valley Authority -TVA. Modern Tupelo is now mostly known as the birthplace of "The King", Elvis Presley.....thank you DL.
